



Texas Voters GOT ID?

You must present one of the following forms of photo ID when voting in person:

- Texas Drivers license issued by DPS
- Texas Personal ID card issued by DPS
- Texas Election ID Certificate (EIC) issued by DPS
- Texas Concealed Handgun License issued by DPS
- US Military or Veteran's ID Card that includes your photo
- US Citizenship Certificate that includes your photo
- US Passport Book or Card

Student IDs are NOT acceptable for voting.

NOTE: With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the identification must be current or have expired no more than 4 years

NEW! If you don't have one of the above, the following along with a declaration that the voter has a "reasonable impediment" to obtaining photo identification, are also accepted. Election workers must accept the reason you give.

- Valid and current voter registration certificate
- Certified birth certificate (must be an original)
- Copy of or original current utility bill
- Copy of or original bank statement
- Copy of or original government check
- Copy of or original paycheck
- Copy of or original government document with your name and an address (original required if it contains a photograph)

Exemptions: Voters with a disability may apply with the county elections office for a permanent exemption to showing ID at the polls. Voters with a religious objection to being photographed or voters who do not have a ID due to certain natural disasters may apply for a temporary exemption. If you are eligible to by mail, no ID is required.

Are You Ready to Vote? Voter Checklist

- I have at least one of the accepted forms of ID listed above
- My ID is current (if expired, it expires no more than 4 years before I voted)
- My name on my ID matches my name on my voter card
- The photo on my ID matches my current appearance
- I know when and where I will vote
